

And those who love to disagree




We live in a world which feeds on division Our hearts are divided as well We pride ourselves in being right And prod and poke at other's wrongs

THE PASSING OF THE PEACE

Lift up your hearts!

We lift them up to the LORD!

Let us give thanks to the LORD our God. It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

At this time we leave the comfort of our seat, turn to our neighbors, grasp their hands, and formally or informally communicate the words, "The peace of the Lord be with you" and receive the words in turn, "And also with you." We also use this time to share God's work in our lives, greet visitors and even seek out brothers and sisters in our midst whom we may need to seek forgiveness and reconciliation.

PARENTS: KidsTable (ages 4-10) is open for your children to attend during the sermon portion of the service and Nursery (ages 0-4) is available throughout the entirety of the service. Both are in the lower level. We also have a nursing mother's room located near the front entrance.

SPIRIT, GIVE US UNDERSTANDING

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Ezekiel 16: 44-55

44 "Behold, everyone who uses proverbs will use this proverb about you: 'Like mother, like daughter.' ⁴⁵ You are the daughter of your mother, who loathed her husband and her children; and you are the sister of your sisters, who loathed their husbands and their children. Your mother was a Hittite and your father an Amorite. 46 And your elder sister is Samaria, who lived with her daughters to the north of you; and your younger sister, who lived to the south of you, is Sodom with her daughters. ⁴⁷ Not only did you walk in their ways and do according to their abominations; within a very little time you were more corrupt than they in all your ways. 48 As I live, declares the Lord God, your sister Sodom and her daughters have not done as you and your daughters have done. 49 Behold, this was the guilt of your sister Sodom: she and her daughters had pride, excess of food, and prosperous ease, but did not aid the poor and needy. 50 They were haughty and did an abomination before me. So I removed them, when I saw it. 51 Samaria has not committed half your sins. You have committed more abominations than they, and have made your sisters appear righteous by all the abominations that you have committed. 52 Bear your disgrace, you also, for you have intervened on behalf of your sisters. Because of your sins in which you acted more abominably than they, they are more in the right than you. So be ashamed, you also, and bear your disgrace, for you have made your sisters appear righteous. 53 "I will restore their fortunes, both the fortunes of Sodom and her daughters, and the fortunes of Samaria and her daughters, and I will restore your own fortunes in their midst, 54 that you may bear your disgrace and be ashamed of all that you have done, becoming a consolation to them. 55 As for your sisters, Sodom and her daughters shall return to their former state, and Samaria and her daughters shall return to their former state, and you and your daughters shall return to your former state.

Reader: This is God's Word.

All: And it is true!

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Acts 8: 9-25

⁹ But there was a man named Simon, who had previously practiced magic in the city and amazed the people of Samaria, saying that he himself was somebody great. ¹⁰ They all paid attention to him, from the least to the greatest, saying, "This man is the power of God that is called Great." ¹¹ And they paid attention to him because for a long time he had amazed them with his magic. ¹² But when they believed Philip as he preached good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women. ¹³ Even Simon himself believed, and after being baptized he continued with Philip. And seeing signs and great miracles performed, he was amazed.

¹⁴ Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent to them Peter and John, ¹⁵ who came down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit, ¹⁶ for he had not yet fallen on any of them, but they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ¹⁷ Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit. ¹⁸ Now when Simon saw that the Spirit was given through the laying on of the apostles' hands, he offered them money, ¹⁹ saying, "Give me this power also, so that anyone on whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit." ²⁰ But Peter said to him, "May your silver perish with you, because you thought you could obtain the gift of God with money! ²¹ You have neither part nor lot in this matter, for your heart is not right before God. ²² Repent, therefore, of this wickedness of yours, and pray to the Lord that, if possible, the intent of your heart may be forgiven you. ²³ For I see that you are in the gall of bitterness and in the bond of iniquity." ²⁴ And Simon answered, "Pray for me to the Lord, that nothing of what you have said may come upon me." ²⁵ Now when they had testified and spoken the word of the Lord, they returned to Jerusalem, preaching the gospel to many villages of the Samaritans

After we pray for our time at the table, please pick up your children from nursery or KidsTable. As you return to your seat, please dispose of the empty cups in the baskets.

Please note: The bread is gluten free. The clear drink is grape juice. The darker is red wine.

Lectio Divina* Practice for the Lenten Season:

²⁰ "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, ²¹ that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²² The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, ²³ I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me.

John 17: 20-23

READ - (lectio)

Read the passage slowly. Then read the passage again asking the Spirit to highlight a word or phrase from the passage. Do not choose the word of phrase for yourself. Take the time to allow the Holy Spirit to lead you to it and welcome what He brings with meekness (a willingness) and thankfulness.

REFLECT - (meditatio)

Read the passage again slowly. Reflect on the word or phrase that stood out to you. Why does this word or phrase resonate with you. Ask God: how does this connect with my life today? What do I need to know or be or do?

RESPOND/PRAY - (oratio)

Read the passage one final time. Prepare yourself for what you want to say to God about what the Holy Spirit brought to you. Pray in whatever way you are led - in exaltation, contrition, thanksgiving, or petition.

REST - (contemplatio)

Be with God. Wait upon Him. Rest in Him. Sit in companionship with Him - the God who seeks you, delights in you and is, in Christ, smiling over you.

*Lectio Divina (which means "divine reading") is a practice of prayerfully and slowly reading and meditating upon a passage of God's Word, allowing space for the Lord to use the passage to minister to you specifically, as His Spirit applies the gospel to your own heart and mind.
