THE PASSING OF THE PEACE

Lift up your hearts!

We lift them up to the LORD!

At this time we leave the comfort of our seat, turn to our neighbors, and formally or informally communicate the words, "The peace of the Lord be with you" and receive the words in turn, "And also with you."

PARENTS: KidsTable (ages 4-10) is open for your children to attend during the sermon portion of the service and Nursery (ages 0-4) is available throughout the entirety of the service. Both are in the lower level. We also have a nursing mother's room located near the front entrance, and a live stream of the service in the downstairs hallway where parents can bring children who need additional attention or space to quiet.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Matthew 5: 17-48

¹⁷ “Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. ¹⁸ For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹ Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰ For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

²¹ “You have heard that it was said to those of old, ‘You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment.’ ²² But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, ‘You fool!’ will be liable to the hell of fire. ²³ So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, ²⁴ leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. ²⁵ Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. ²⁶ Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.

²⁷ “You have heard that it was said, ‘You shall not commit adultery.’ ²⁸ But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. ²⁹ If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell. ³⁰ And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell. ³¹ “It was also said, ‘Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.’ ³² But I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of sexual immorality, makes her commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

³³ “Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, ‘You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn.’ ³⁴ But I say to you, Do not take an oath at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, ³⁵ or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. ³⁶ And do not take an oath by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. ³⁷ Let what you say be simply ‘Yes’ or ‘No’; anything more than this comes from evil.

³⁸ “You have heard that it was said, ‘An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.’ ³⁹ But I say to you, Do not resist the one who is evil. But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. ⁴⁰ And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. ⁴¹ And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles. ⁴² Give to the one who begs from you, and do not refuse the one who would borrow from you.

⁴³ “You have heard that it was said, ‘You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.’ ⁴⁴ But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. ⁴⁶ For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same?

Applying The Gospel of Matthew

Scripture for Meditation: Matthew 5:48

You therefore must be perfect,
as your heavenly Father is perfect.

READ - (lectio)

Read the passage slowly. Then read the passage again asking the Spirit to highlight a word or phrase from the passage. Do not choose the word or phrase for yourself. Take the time to allow the Holy Spirit to lead you to it and welcome what He brings with meekness (a willingness) and thankfulness.

REFLECT - (meditatio)

Read the passage again slowly. Reflect on the word or phrase that stood out to you. Why does this word or phrase resonate with you. Ask God: how does this connect with my life today? What do I need to know or be or do?

RESPOND/PRAY - (oratio)

Read the passage one final time. Prepare yourself for what you want to say to God about what the Holy Spirit brought to you. Pray in whatever way you are led - in exaltation, contrition, thanksgiving, or petition.

REST - (contemplatio)

Be with God. Wait upon Him. Rest in Him. Sit in companionship with Him - the God who seeks you, delights in you and is, in Christ, smiling over you.

Application:

Carve a window of time to reflect on Matthew 5:48.

Consider both the perfections of Christ given to you in grace and also the opportunity to display those perfections in your living faithfully according to his law.

Of the five exhibits Jesus displayed in the sermon on the mount, which of those applications of the law most convict you to confession and repentance?

God's law has a threefold purpose. 1. A floor - To preserve and protect God's creation from coming completely undone. 2. A mirror - To show us our falling short in sin. 3. A ceiling - to show us the nature of our God and his love. Ask the Lord to show you various ways this week in which He might use you to show the world his love through his law.
